is an innovative artist with an increasing national reputation.

Brooke's images are two-dimensional works on paper. She combines relief, letterpress, and intaglio printmaking with Japanese Sumi (ink washes) and collage techniques. Brooke selects insects, birds, and other natural objects from her Nebraska home to combine with family portraits, texts from scientific treatises, and personal letters. The artist layers these into delicate pieces that celebrate human interactions with the natural world, seeking points of familiarity shared by often incongruous subject matter.

Kate Brooke's work has been exhibited in twenty states. In 2004, the Hilton Convention Facility in Omaha installed four of Brooke's prints on permanent public display. Highlights of 2003 were two solo exhibitions entitled "Tracks & Tangos" at the New Hampshire Institute of Art in Manchester, and "Tracks & Sign" at Nebraska's Norfolk Arts Center. Other notable solo exhibitions include "Sappho & Coleoptera: texts and animalia" at the Haydon Gallery in Lincoln, Nebraska (2001) and "Field Guides" at the Museum of

Nebraska Art in Kearney (1997). Ms Brooke's print *Leda and the calf...* received an Award of Merit from the Museum of Nebraska Art in their "Prairie Light Arts Showcase" in 1994. Ms. Brooke has shown work in national competitions such as "The Boston Printmakers 1999 North American Print Exhibition," where juror Marilyn Kushner, Curator of Prints and Drawings at the Brooklyn Museum of Art, awarded Brooke a commendation for the print *Fledge*. Born in Arizona in 1960, Brooke moved to Nigeria when she was five. Returning to the U.S.A. in 1967, she grew up in Seattle, Washington, and spent some years in Minneapolis, Minnesota, before choosing Nebraska as her home in 1984. She founded her Lincoln, Nebraska, studio, the Opossum Track Press, in 1990.

ARTIST'S STATEMENT:

The images included here are drawn from an ongoing body of work entitled *Field Guides*. *Field Guides* emerges from my fascination with the natural world and its intersection with human thoughts and lives. My imagery includes birds, insects, and other natural objects; natural textures, leaf, dance and migration patterns. These are printed over Sumi, collage, and sometimes intaglio backgrounds. Embedded in these images are texts from scientific treatises, family history, poetry and letters. My sources range from natural history guides, to fragments of papyrus, to personal correspondences,


and to dissertations on subjects such as stress management in poultry.

Field Guides, and the artistic process behind this work, evolves from an openness and attentiveness to place. Although I have lived as far away as Nigeria, the Pacific Northwest, Minnesota and Arizona, it is my home in Nebraska where I find a wealth of material for developing images. I collect flora and fauna, poetry and prose, watching for markings and contextual patterns that make something individually identifiable, in a specific habitat. I am intrigued by place, by the human and natural content that create the possibility for meaning in any site.
